1. General Information

1.1. Project Information

The aim of the project was to provide food relief and assistance to vulnerable families and households in the informal settlement affected by the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions and situations which has led to massive lay off of casual workers, closure of business premises due to partial lockdown and inadequate resource to support families due inadequate incomes. The relief was to enable families without food to have some meals and support hard hit families with children who apparently are in need of support for food sufficiency.

The project also targeted persons with disability and single parents or widows who have challenges in provision food due to inadequate incomes and livelihoods due banning of several small-scale business due COVID Pandemic restrictions i.e. hawking of products and food stuff.

The source of information for this critical situation was initially the concern of the church, village elders in the informal settlement and the periodic media reports of the critical situation attributed to the COVID-19 pandemic negative impacts.

The following are the key objectives of the project

- a) Provision of food to vulnerable families and cushion them from hunger
- b) Provide stability in the families reducing cases of gender-based violence due to inadequate food
- c) Provision of relief to the needy families
- d) Support children who need adequate support of food in their respective homes
- e) Provision of leverage to meet their daily needs

The key outcome has been provision of relief food packages to assist the following groups of families

a) Vulnerable church members who are struggling due to inadequate income & livelihoods due to COVID -19 Pandemic

- b) Persons living with disabilities who cannot access any form of income due to their situation and the negative impacts of COVID-19 pandemic based on partial lockdown making them stay in-doors hence inability to secure food & livelihoods
- c) Community members who lost their jobs & sources of income due to the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions & partial lockdown are in dire need of food to ensure provision of meals to their family members.

The provision of food packages was overwhelming and the project managed to spread the food packages to 240 households/families due to the demand of several households requiring urgent food relief support including persons with disability families. Yet the initial plan was to provide food packages to 80 families.

Demand for assistance is very high due to COVID -19 pandemic restrictions & partial lockdown we are still receiving request but the food items have been provided to the prioritized needy communities and church members from the Mukuru informal settlement. The way forward is perhaps to extend the project further for the next 2months but targeting approximately 200-300families for assistance to able to reach all the vulnerable groups adequately before the restrictions are clearly eased to allow all business to operate so that most of the community members can be sustainable in meeting their food demands due return to normalcy.
