#### 1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The project embarked on providing assistance to victims of floods in Nyando sub county of Kisumu County. Implementation of the project was delayed due to COVID-19 restriction and therefore started in May,2020 by distribution of food stuff after lifting restrictions key activities started in July up to August,2020. The project had identified various needs based on the floods disaster. The following are the key concerns.

- a) Inadequate shelter due to collapse of houses/housing structure due to flooding of homesteads
- b) Inadequate sanitation facilities due to collapse of latrines and inaccessible homesteads
- c) Inadequate food supplies due to flooding of farms and destruction of crops by floods & hippos residing in flooded areas
- d) Limitation of livelihoods due flooding of market areas/ business premises

Therefore, the project planned to relieve the community of the problems through engagements to assess their needs and plan for specific interventions. To facilitate appropriate actions to restore human dignity KUMEA engaged the community through consultative meetings and agreed on the following key resolutions

- a) Facilitate construction of 20no. houses for the community members who are vulnerable and poor suffering from flood afflictions. The houses to use appropriate materials for construction with community participation to reduce costs. KUMEA to provide hardware materials as per the planned housing designs.
- b) Facilitate construction of 30no. households' latrines through provision of latrine slabs. Community to provide sand, ballast and unskilled labor. KUMEA to provide skilled labor and hardware materials
- c) Provision of food packages to 55no. Vulnerable families to alleviate hunger for households afflicted with floods in the various target villages.

The project therefore facilitated implementation process and liaised with respective church leaders to address the situation. Funding of the project was done by Apostle Horold Eckhardt at a cost of US\$ 8,000(Kshs. 808,000). Project team and the beneficiaries appreciate the funding for it has impacted positively on the lives of the vulnerable community members who have now access to decent shelter, secured food provision in times of hunger and access to improved sanitation.

We thank God for the support provided by Apostle Harold Eckhardt for this noble funding for the project that alleviates human suffering by provision of food stuff, shelter and improved sanitation in time of need.

### 2.0 COMMUNITY MEETINGS & ENGAGEMENTS FOR PROJECT RELIEF SUPPORT

To facilitate implementation of the relief support activities the project team organized meetings in the target villages to assess and plan relevant realistic actions. The villages targeted through consultation with local church leadership are as follows;

- a) Omboko village
- b) Ongeche village
- c) Kanyagwal village

The purpose of targeting these villages was due their vulnerability. Several houses had been destroyed with floods and community access to food supplies proved to be difficult and inadequate due to destruction of their farm land and livelihoods.

Due to inadequate shelter the villagers had been affected by wild animals especially hippos which reside in flood prone areas and were constantly causing havoc to community members especially at night. Destruction of homes also affected access to sanitation since their latrines have collapsed and exposed the communities to diarrheal diseases.

Therefore, the purpose of the community was to agree on the following key aspects;

- a) Mobilization of local resources to support implementation of project activities
   i.e. contribution towards construction of houses by provision of walling materials and
   engagement of unskilled labor
- b) Mobile for provision of sand, ballast and unskilled labour during the production of sanitation slabs for sanitation improvements for vulnerable households
- c) Identify vulnerable households for food stuff packages and relief support in the respective villages
- d) Identify artisan to engaged for latrine slab production
- e) Identify vulnerable households for the support of the housing project
- f) Develop implementation schedules of the various project components i.e. Relief food provision, Construction of houses and Sanitation development at households' level.

## 3.0 PROVISION & SUPPORT OF FOOD PACKAGES TO VULNERABLE FAMILIES

The project provided food stuff to 85no. families from different villages (1<sup>st</sup> distribution involved 35no. families and 2<sup>nd</sup> distribution involved 50no. families). The provision of food stuff was meant to alleviate them from hunger since most of the community members could rely on food from their farms. Most their farms had been submerged in the floods and could not be accessed. Therefore, the foodstuff provided consisted of the following food packages per household family.

## 4.0 CONSTRUCTION SUPPORT OF HOUSES AND SHELTERS FOR VULNERABLE FAMILIES

The project supported the construction of houses to facilitate community members access decent shelter after their houses had been flooded. To facilitate the construction of the houses for families whose homes had been flooded the project provided the following items per affected vulnerable households;

- a) 21no. iron sheets (3m) —Dumu zas
- b) Roofing paint-4 Litres
- c) Roofing nails -2kg
- d) Transport for materials

Households and community members provided the following materials

- a) Poles for walls and roofing
- b) Unskilled and skilled labour
- c) Provide mud & wattle for the walls or provision of old roofs for walling materials

The project has supported the construction of 20 households in the respective target villages of Nyando. The houses have transformed community members and enabled them to have decent shelter for their children. Most of the supported families are elderly, widows and the vulnerable poor in those target villages. The following are the vulnerable families that received assistance for house &shelter construction materials to facilitate construction of houses. Currently 4no. houses are complete with 16no. underconstruction.

## 5.0 CONSTRUCTION SUPPORT OF SANITATION IMPROVEMENTS FOR VULNERABLE HOUSEHOLDS

Construction of latrines is on-going in the various villages. The community are mobilizing key materials i.e. sand, ballast and providing unskilled labour. The project is targeting ton have 30no. households to have latrines especially those who relocated from the flooding fields. The project has been supporting household sanitation component by providing cement, reinforcement bars and skilled labour payments.

The following is the distribution of sanitation improvement materials in the target villages and households to be covered.
